

SAMPLE COVID-19 Memo for Parents of Children Attending Summer Day Camps

This sample letter template can be used by your day camp to provide information to parents about the precautions that you are taking to keep camp participants and staff safe. Feel free to cut and paste as you wish into your letterhead.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

The health and safety of camp participants and staff in our program is our goal. We strive to create safe spaces for the camp participants and staff that use them every day, and we are working with Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph Public Health (WDGPH) to make this happen. As a result, some regular routines, procedures and physical spaces may have been changed to control and prevent the transmission of COVID-19.

What are Day Camps doing differently to keep everyone safe?

- Staff, camp participants, and parents/guardians are being screened for illness and any symptoms each day before attending the program.
- Staff and camp participants who are unwell are not allowed to attend the program and are sent home.
- The day camp has enhanced cleaning and disinfecting procedures. This includes frequent and detailed cleaning and disinfecting of highly touched surfaces and objects.
- Staff and camp participants are being instructed on proper hand hygiene including washing their hands often throughout the day.
- Staff are finding ways to maintain physical distance between camp participants and staff when possible throughout the day including:
 - smaller groups
 - staggering lunchtime and outdoor playtime
 - creating activities camp participants can enjoy by themselves

How can parents help?

- Screen yourself, and your child, for symptoms daily. Use the provincial [self-assessment tool](#).
- Pick-up and drop-off your child(ren) outside the day camp at the designated area.

What happens if a camp participant develops symptoms while at camp?

- A camp participant who shows symptoms will be moved away from other camp participants and supervised until their parents or guardian can pick them up.
- Parents or guardian, of the camp participant who developed symptoms, will be called right away and asked to come pick up their child.
- The supervising staff will try to keep a 2 metre (6ft) distance from the ill child and both staff and child (if tolerated) will wear a mask. Staff will wear other appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), as necessary.
- You will be asked to take your child to be tested for COVID-19.

What if another child or staff has symptoms or tests positive for COVID-19?

- Anyone with symptoms of COVID-19 will be asked to be tested for COVID-19.
- Anyone who was in close contact with the person who developed symptoms will be grouped together, during their time in the day camp program, until more is known about the test results or further direction is received from Public Health.
- If a staff or child tests positive for COVID-19, Public Health will work with the day camp operator to determine other staff or camp participants who need to be tested or go home and self-isolate for 14 days.
